Core Values

Universal Behavior Policies

- Show respect for people, property, and the learning process.
- Be in correct uniform.
- Use school-appropriate and responsible language.
- Remain awake, alert, and engaged in class.
- Come to class on time and prepared to learn.
- Come to class without food, candy, gum, or unauthorized beverages.
- Come to class without cell phones or other unauthorized electronic devices.

Communicating High Expectations

- We believe in over-communication. We will contact you often to celebrate what your child is doing well and what expectations your child needs support in meeting.
- We track our interventions with students in PowerSchool. We call this tracking "log entries".
- There are two types of log entries:
 - Commendation Log Entries
 - When students consistently meet or exceed expectations, we create a commendation log entry. This creates a data point for us to record student leadership. This celebrates how students are models of the high expectations we have in our building and how these students are positive contributors to our culture.
 - Corrective Log Entries
 - When students do not meet our expectations, we create a corrective log entry. This creates a data point for us to record unmet expectations.
 - If we notice a pattern, we will have a parent meeting.
 - Egregious instances of unmet expectations may result in escalated interventions.



Corrective Log Accountability

- Corrective log entries accumulate over the course of a quarter and may be logged by any teacher or administrator. The accumulation of such logs results in a progression of consequences ranging from simple warnings to possible expulsion.

Short-Term Accountability

Accumulation in One Week	Result
4	Detention

Long Term Accountability

Accumulation in One Quarter	Result
8	Intervention with Assistant Head of School
16	Intervention with Assistant Head of School & Parents + 2hr detention
24	Intervention with Assistant Head of School & Parents + one day suspension, possible Saturday School
32	Intervention with the Assistant Head of School, parents, faculty + minimum two-day suspension, possible Saturday School, possible expulsion
